EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

As myself and the NOMA of Central Texas Board developed our programming and visioning for 2023, we leaned in on the conversations and connections that have happened over the last 4 years. In that reflection, it became clear to us that the trend was towards bridge building and deepening our commitment to our shared purpose partners, and our NOMA Texas South Region counterparts in Dallas and Houston. This provided the backdrop for a very impactful year highlighted below.

In February 2023 we kicked off our programming with a friendly design competition to celebrate our history. We called on participants to design a flag to help us build our brand. Entries were voted on in March and merch items were produced using the various designs throughout the year. It was the perfect way to engage our membership around our mission and values. In March, we gathered together at Lake Flato's newly renovated office space for an amazing afternoon together with our membership, sponsors, and supportive community members.

After several months of planning In June, we hosted our inaugural Wellness Retreat Weekend in collaboration with DFW NOMA and Houston NOMA in Austin, TX. The purpose of the Wellness Weekend is to provide an opportunity for connection and networking amongst the Texas NOMA chapters, but more importantly it is a chance to re-charge and step away from the busyness of our collective workplaces in search of balance. In 2023 - we had over 40 participants from all across the State convene with us in Austin, and are looking forward to a Houston retreat in 2024.

In July 2023, we hosted our 3rd Project Pipeline Architecture Summer Camp in partnership with The University of Texas School of Architecture, the University of Texas at San Antonio, and the City of San Antonio. Over the 2 days in both Austin and San Antonio, we were able to connect with 60+ 5th thru 12th grade students, a record number for us. Our curriculum was enhanced through our partnership with the City of San Antonio, City Makery, and their Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU) Design Competition. Our Campers became the first round of community engagement related to the City's ADU initiative. NOMA Central Texas was a partner in this effort from the grant application stage until award of the various competition winners later in the Fall. The connection to real life and policy made our 2023 camp more tangible for students, and introduced them to the practice of Architecture while deepening the critical connections with volunteer college students from the NOMAS chapters at UT San Antonio and UTSOA, staff from both institutions, and the broader Central Texas community.

The Fall was again a time for homecomings and re-connections. October 2023 was the 52nd anniversary of NOMA and we came together with our national partners and each other in Portland, Oregon where our NOMA of Central Texas chapter was distinguished as the NATIONAL SMALL CHAPTER OF THE YEAR!!! The highest honor that an individual NOMA Chapter can be awarded. It's worth noting that we were recognized in 2022 as a 5 star Chapter. There are 45 professional chapters across the country and in the UK.

On the heels of our NOMA Conference win, we rounded out our year by hosting our inaugural NOMA Empower Design Symposium. In the fall we had a call for short format accessible entries on topics in architecture related to Design, Advocacy, and Justice. Our presentations were diverse, but singularly focused on themes related to our mission. By all measures the symposium was a success, and was capped by AIA Houston's current President, Melvalean Mclemore as our keynote Empower Speaker series Speaker.

I am overjoyed to continue leading this small but deeply impactful and relevant organization. It has been such a privelege to steward the group well and mentor and be mentored by the best our profession has to offer over the years. We will continue to make big impacts not impressions with the support of our strong membership base, and partners like you. Thank you so much! Let's find ways to continue working together in 2024 and beyond. We can't do it without you.



- 1. PROJECT PIPELINE Is a NOMA National Initiative to educate young students on the impact of design and advocacy within the field of Architecture. Project Pipeline is set us an an annual camp with flexibility to occur as a week long camp or even after school activity for students to participate and learn about the fundamentals of Architecture. The program is meant to usher in a new generation of students who exemplify the growing demographic of our BIPOC community in an underrepresented field of architecture. Throughout the camp, students will learn the basic contributors to architecture as a built form and the impact societally that buildings have on the social environment of it's neighborhood. For the last 3 years, NOMA Of Central Texas has been able to provide Scholarships to select students who go through our project pipeline camp and are enrolled in a design related program. In 2024 our goal is to continue to expand our program in both the amount of time we spend with the Campers and our regional reach.
- 2. EMPOWER SPEAKER SERIES Is a yearly event that centers on amplifying the voices of our NOMA members and under-represented professionals who exemplify thoughtful design and advocacy within the field of architecture, construction, and design. This series expands on our members' experience in the field of architecture, their contributions to design, and how they have advocated for a better built environment in the process.
- 3. DESIGN SYMPOSIUM Will be organized by NOMA of Central Texas where our NOMA Community will gather together to co-produce a day long event where members will present their research and thought leadership around a specific theme that supports our mission to deepen the visibility, support of, and solidarity of under represented people in the field of architecture and beyond. The event will be anchored by a Kenote Speaker and will seek to bring together the best of all of our Texas NOMA Chapters.
- 4. AEC RESOURCE DIRECTORY The Resource Directory will be a central catalog of information where industry partners, potential clients, and potential employers can all search for a professional in the architecture and construction industry who identifies as Black, Indigenous, or

 Person of Color. This resource directory will extend beyond Architecture and is meant to identify contractors, subcontractors, consultants, interior designers, product representatives, and architects. The cataloging of these industry professionals will also serve to empower members within the directory to form a sense of community while also supporting one another through industry channels.
- **5. HOUSING EDUCATION** NOMA of Central Texas will host Curated discussions on Housing issues in Central Texas continuing our examination and education on housing and it's affordability for industry professionals and our regional community. The impacts to the built environment, local policy, and to our own BIPOC communities. Panel discussions, Seminars, and interactive activities led by experts in policy, architecture, and urban design will moderate our discussions, and lead audience Q&A.
- 6. ARE SUPPORT INITIATIVES In 2021 NCARB revealed that only twenty-two percent of licensed Architects in the United States identified as a racial minority. Of that twenty-two percent only two percent identified as Black/African American despite making up 12 percent of the U.S. Population. NOMA of Central Texas will develop robust support initiatives to continue to strengthen the pipeline of credentialed Black and Minority Architects in our region.




















Central to our mission at NOMA of Central Texas is to empower young people to affect change in their community through design. We advocate for increased diversity, fellowship, equity, and excellence in design. Project Pipeline uses the city as the classroom, and connects young people to real world architects and planners to foster the next generation of design professionals, civic leaders, and change makers. Our 2023 Curriculum included further engagement through and Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU) education and a competition

The 2023 camp was hosted in person at UTSA and UT Austin over two days. Students were sectioned into small groups and paired with mentors from the professional community and Architecture students from the student chapters of NOMAS at UTSA and UT Austin. The mentors helped to guide the students through a series of design exercises like LEGO building, sketching, and collage creation. All of this lead to the students designing and building a model of an improvement for their City.

Throughout the activities, mentors shared their experiences in Architecture school and in professional practice to give the students a better idea of what the profession of Architecture is like. During the lunch hour, students from the NOMAS chapters at UTSA and UT Austin gave presentations on the programs at their schools and lead tours of the facilities. Students are highly encouraged to present their projects to each other at the end of camp. Camper awards, including scholarships, were discussed by mentors and awarded to students based on the deliberations at the end of camp.


















Student Gender










Student Race








DESIGN BRIEF

To be marginalized in America is to be a star on the face of midnight. We constantly have to rise above everything and shine our brightest When it's dark outside.

- Rudy Francisco

Sirius is a visual translation of the poem Margin by African-American spoken word poet Rudy Francisco. Francisco's oeuvre confronts issues of race and politics, and in Margin, he expresses the diminishing feelings of marginalization through the beauty of celestial imagery. While emphasizing a star's solidarity and comparing it to social exclusion, he challenges us to "shine our brightest" as an exemplar for social change.

Through a natural meander drawn from Waller Creek, NOMA's Sirius breaks down the rigidity of the bridge's infrastructure and guides users through a collection of star-laden vessels – a visual representation of the beauty and strength of marginalized communities. When we come together we shine brighter through the darkness.
